This event is a qualifier for the 2010 Individual World Poetry Slam (iWPS) that will be held October 13 - 15th, in Philadelphia, PA.

Rules for iWPS Qualifier:

Any poet that has participated in three or more MO Poetry Slam Springfield Slams since August 2009 are eligible to qualify.

Round 1 - All poets may read a poem of 1 minute in length

Round 2 - All poets may read a poem of 4 minutes in length

Round 3 - All poets may read a poem of 2 minutes in length

Round 4 - All poets may read a poem of 3 minutes in length

- \* Scores are cumulative.
- \* First round order is by random draw.
- \* In subsequent rounds the order is highest scoring poet goes first and then down the list.
- \* Ties for first place will be settled by a tiebreaker additional round determined by the bout manager
- \* The first 10 poets to sign up at the door may compete. (Poet sign up starts at 6:30pm)
- \* All participants will also be required to pay the \$5 cover fee
- \* Each poem must be of the poet's own construction.
- \* If the poet goes over time (plus a ten-second grace period), points will be deducted from the total score.
- \* The poet may not use props, costumes or musical instruments.
- \* If winning poet is unable to attend iWPS, the runner up will move into the representative slot.

MOPoetry Slam Springfield will pay the winners iWPS application fee and try to help the winning poet with trip expenses.

Winning poet will still be subject to some financial obligations toward travel costs, boarding and food.

Winning poet MUST become a Poetry Slam Incorporated (PSi) member to participate at iWPS. Please visit PSi at

## Missouri State Poetry Society Summer Contest 2010

Deadline: Postmarked September 1, 2010

**Format**: Submit two copies of each entry, category number and name in upper left hand corner of both copies, poet's name and address in upper right hand corner of one copy. If you are a member put "Missouri State Poetry Society" below your address. Put "Non-member" if you are not.

**Limits**: Poems may be 40 or fewer lines. They may be unpublished or previously published if the poet retains the rights to the poem. Poets may enter each category as many times as they wish. No poems will be returned.

#### **Categories:**

- 1. Rhymed verse or blank verse (unrhymed iambic pentameter), any subject, serious or humorous.
- 2. Free verse, any subject, serious or humorous.
- 3. Humorous verse, any subject.

#### **AUGUST 1. 2010**

- 4. Any form, summer subject, serious or humorous.
- 5. MSPS members only. Poet's choice any form (including open-field, shaped, or concrete poetry), any subject, serious or humorous.

**Fees**: Non-members pay \$1.00 per entry. Members pay \$1.00 for two entries except for Category 5 in which they pay \$1.00 per entry. Make money order or check payable to MSPS and mail to

Include an SASE or your e-mail address on a 3X5 index card for a list of the winners.

**Prizes:** \$25, \$15, \$10, and three honorable mentions in each category.

## **Convention speakers**




Paul Willis Professor of English, Westmont College, Santa Barbra CA

Paul Willis grew up in Corvallis, Oregon, where his father taught biology at Oregon State University. He attended Wheaton College in Illinois, worked as a mountain guide in the Cascades and Sierra Nevada, and earned his graduate degrees in English at Washington State University. For over twenty years now, he has been a professor of English at Westmont College in Santa Barbara, where his wife, Sharon, is employed as a registered nurse. They have two grown children.

Paul is the author of two books of poetry, Rosing from the Dead (WordFarm, 2009) and Visiting Home (Pecan Grove Press, 2008), and one book of creative nonfiction, Bright Shoots of Everlastingness: Essays on Faith and the American Wild (WordFarm, 2005). With David Starkey, he is co-editor of In a Fine Frenzy: Poets Respond to Shakespeare (University of Iowa Press, 2005).

His poems and essays have appeared in *The Best American Poetry 1996* (Scribner's), *The Best Spiritual Writing 1999* (HarperSanFrancisco), *The Best American Spiritual Writing 2004* (Houghton Mifflin), *The Best Christian Writing 2006* (Jossey Bass), *Verse Daily*, and *The Writer's Almanac*.

Forthcoming from WordFarm in 2010 is his four-part eco-fantasy novel, The Alpine Tales.



David Clewell, Missouri Poet laureate

DAVID CLEWELL is the author of eight collections of poetry—most recently, *The Low End of Higher Things*—and two booklength poems, His work regularly appears in a wide variety of national magazines and journals and has been represented in over sixty anthologies. His honors include several book awards: The Felix Pollak Poetry Prize (for *Now We're Getting Somewhere*), National Poetry Series selection (for *Blessings in Disguise*), and the inaugural Four Lakes Poetry Prize for *Taken Somehow By Surprise*, his new collection forthcoming in Spring 2011 from the University of Wisconsin Press. He is currently the Poet Laureate of Missouri.

Clewell teaches writing and literature at Webster University in St. Louis, where he also directs the English Department's creative writing program.
